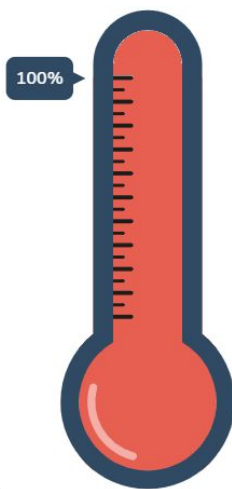
Student Spotlight
